Iowa Iron Pour

In June 2017 Stephen Hargash organized a trip to Decorah, Iowa sponsored by the Frankenmuth Arts Council to participate in a special artist invite event, where they experienced the many different processes involved with casting metal. Gary Gavit, Billy Budd, Ryan Buyssens, John Martinez, Jonathon Martinez, and Sean Gallagher were the six local artists and members of the Frankenmuth Arts Council who participated. This was a first time experience for many of the artists that accompanied Stephen.

with mold making such as; working with lost wax process, ceramic shell, and plasticine clay, along with rubber mold techniques to create their sculptures.

The experience took place on the farmland of Kelly Ludeking, who along with Brad Hertko, and Justin and Karen Peters run Ironhead Sculptural Services. All four of these artists are longtime colleagues of Stephen Hargash who met and developed their working relationship while attending the Minneapolis College of Art and Design.

The artists were shown the basic steps involved The seven artists travelled to Iowa and camped on site along with other artists from around the country. On Wednesday they arrived and set up camp, while Thursday and Friday consisted of sand mold preparation and breaking up iron to be melted down in the furnace. The artists broke up old radiators into small pieces to be melted down for the iron. On Saturday, molds were finished and set in place; the furnace was assembled and fired up. The pour then proceeded in the late afternoon and went into the evening until every piece was poured. Visually, the Iron Pour is an amazing thing to witness. The Arts Council goal was to give the artists involved an educational experience as well as develop a dialogue with the Ironhead artists with the hopes of bringing their team to Frankenmuth to start our own Iron Pour, giving not only local artists access to this amazing art form but also the community. We are currently working towards launching our own Iron Pour event where we can work with youth and adults from the community to have the opportunity to create their own cast iron sculptures.
